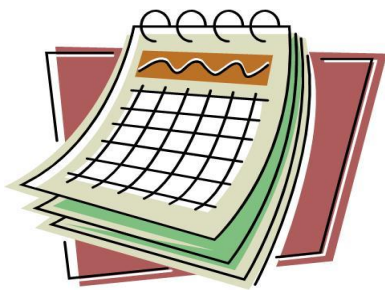

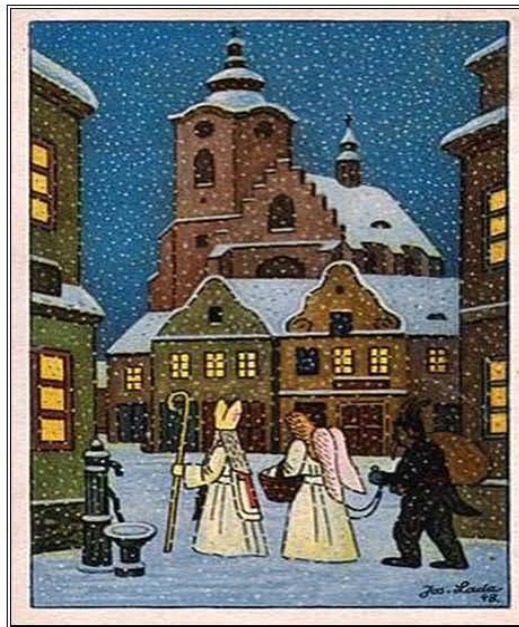

Those who were lucky enough to get there early were able to buy whole dumplings and *kolače* to take home. The beverage of choice was, of course, *české pivo*; Dana Havlik, Dana Petran, Anna Losovsky, Olga Mendel provided lots of homemade pastries; hot dogs and bratwursts proved to be popular as well.
